42. Working Hunter – Open Horse. Gelding or mare 4 years old and over exceeding 153cm. For horses with **less** than 50 S.J.A.I. points or 20 E.I. points on day of show.

- All entries for the Hall Section must be presented at the Show Hall, before 10.00 am on the 26th July.
- All exhibits must be the Bona Fide property of the Exhibitor.
- Prizes may be withheld in classes in which there is not sufficient competition.
- Exhibitors are hereby notified that, although every reasonable precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of all the exhibits, the Committee cannot be deemed responsible for accident of any kind which may occur. Neither will the Committee be responsible for any accident which may happen to any person attending the Show, whether as an exhibitor, official, steward, visitor or otherwise.
- The Committee shall not be responsible for any mistake in an entry form.
- A person who enters an exhibit and fails to present it shall forfeit the entry fee.
- Exhibitors are responsible for the display of their exhibits in the places allotted to them.
- Vegetables for exhibition should be cleaned.
- The decision of the Committee shall be final in all matters except the adjudication of exhibits and livestock; and in all matters of adjudication the decision of the Judges shall be final.
- The only persons who shall accompany Judges during adjudication shall be their stewards.
- The award of prizes made by a Judge and recorded in the Judge's Award Book shall be final notwithstanding any error that may be made by a steward or other official in placing a prize card on any exhibit.
- Exhibits shall not be removed before 4.00 pm on the day of the Show.
- Entries in the Livestock Section must be received by the Hon. Secretary on or before Saturday, 18th July 2015. Hall entries taken on Show Day.
